Builder is unknown, but possibly James Worden of Preston
(fl. 1873-1904 and previously with Ainscough).

One manual: compass 54 (cc – f)
Pedalboard: compass 17 (cc – e) pull-downs only
Key Action: Tracker throughout
Drawstop action: Mechanical
Electrically blown

Case to front and sides.
Piano-fold lid over the keyboard.
Fine wood finish.
Display pipes speaking.

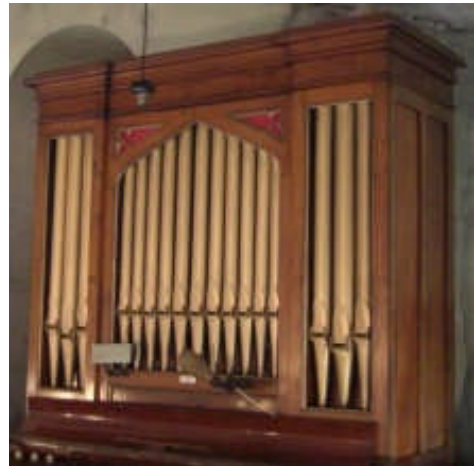
The following information was found inside the soundboard:

Jas Worden Preston
W. Walker
Set up in St James' Whitechapel Kew (or New?) Church 1889
Vicar E. D. Banister.”

The organ was restored by J M Spink, Organ Builder, in 1987.
Recently removed from the church by Malcolm Spink and stored in his factory.
